

Where can I ride an E bike/Eboards?

E Bike Classifications:

- Class 1: Pedal-assisted with max speed of 20 MPH
- Class 2: Throttle assisted with max speed of 20 MPH
- Class 3: Pedal-assisted with max speed of 28 MPH

In Snowmass Village: Sec 10-31

“All E-Bikes including E-Boards are Prohibited on all Unpaved and Dirt Trails in Snowmass Village”

Class 1 e-bikes are **prohibited on any unpaved** bike or pedestrian path or trail and **permitted on paved** bike or pedestrian paths or trails

Class 2 and Class 3 e-bikes are **prohibited on any bike or pedestrian path or trail** and **only permitted on roadways**

E-BIKE REGULATIONS

“Pitkin County allows Class 1, pedal-assist e-bikes on paved trails plus the gravel East of Aspen Trail and the gravel section of the Rio Grande Trail. E-bike use is not permitted on any single-track trail on Pitkin County’s open spaces. A Class 1 bike must be pedaled in order to operate and has a maximum speed of 20 mph.”

E-bikes prohibited on all trails, roads (with the exception of county roads), lifts, or gondolas within ASC’s permitted boundaries on the White River National Forest

White River National Forest

“E-bikes may be ridden on designated motorized routes shown on Motor Vehicle Use Maps including on National Forest System (NFS) roads open to all vehicles; and national forest system trails open to all vehicles. Certain roads and trails are only open during certain times of the year.

The best source of information on knowing when and where e-bikes are allowed on the White River National Forest can be found on the White River National Forest Motor Vehicle Use Maps. Hard copies are available at all forest office.”
