



## ACTIVITIES

### Mountain Biking



**ADVANCED** Mixture of steep climbs and steeper descent. Rocks and technical moves often required. Jumps, rock gardens and roots may be encountered. These are the ones that will tire you out, maybe leave you with some bruises, and probably scare you, at least a little bit.  
Suggested ride: South and North Rim, Snowmass Bike Park

**INTERMEDIATE** Climbs and descents will be at steeper grades than beginner trails. They may be longer and have more sidehill exposure. More rocks. These are good for those with more advanced bike handling skills or a willingness to walk. Best after you've had a day to get used to the altitude.  
Suggested ride: Discovery Trail (climb) Village Bound (descent)

**BEGINNER** These trails require little physical exertion. They have gentle climbs and descents. They may be wider or even double track. You will find mostly smooth tracks with few or no rocks and "moves." Great for beginners or groups of mixed ability. Also good for your first day up at our elevation.  
Suggested ride: Ditchline-Lowline



### Hiking Trails

**ALL LEVELS** Hit the 2 mile Vista Trail and hike till your heart is content! This hiking-only trail starts near the bottom of the Elk Camp Gondola and traverses up the mountain through lush aspen groves to the Elk Camp Restaurant. If that's not enough, continue up the mountain on the Sierra Club and Summit Trails (also hiking-only) which lead to the summit and huge views of the Elk Mountain Range.



### Horseback

**ALL LEVELS** The Upper North Mesa Equestrian Trail is a great, 2-hour horseback ride with breathtaking, 360° degree views of Snowmass Village, Aspen, and the surrounding Elk Mountain Range.

Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center

Snowmass, along with the rest of the Roaring Fork Valley is part of the first IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center™ in Colorado, designated by the International Mountain Biking Association. The IMBA Gold-Level designation, the top award for mountain biking destinations, offers mountain bike enthusiasts more than 300 miles of high quality single track from Aspen and Snowmass to Basalt, Carbondale, and Glenwood Springs. Guests riding in Snowmass and the Roaring Fork Valley can take their pick of adventure, from lift-served gravity trails in the Snowmass Bike Park and expert-only long rides, to family-friendly trails and backcountry adventures. The Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center is the first Gold-Level Ride Center in Colorado, only the fifth in United States, and among seven in the world.

## TRAIL TIPS

- Have Fun!
  - Be Nice!
  - Be Safe - Don't ride fast and take chances
  - Share the Trail!
  - Uphill has the right of way. But if it is easier for you to move, please do so.
  - Stop for other trail users when descending
  - Communicate - Often you'll be on your own, but when you encounter others... Say 'hi' - It's nice; If overtaking someone, let them know how many are in your group; If it's easier for you to yield to them, please do so
  - Don't be obnoxiously loud
  - Don't ride E-bikes on dirt trails - CLASS 1 is only type of E-bike allowed on PAVED Snowmass Trails. NO E-bike is permitted on dirt trails or ski area trails
  - Plan your route - Snowmass has 90+ miles of hiking and biking trails for you to explore
  - Respect private property
  - Leave No Trace! Pack it in/Pack it out
  - We Love Animals!
- Please respect wildlife; Wild animals are wild; Give them space and never feed them; Always yield to larger creatures (like horses); Don't let your dog greet others without permission; Obey the leash laws; Please pick up poop! There is no poop fairy to pick up plastic bags.
